### **Prevention with Positives Training Offered by CA HIV/STD Prevention Training Center**

*Partnership for Health (PfH)* is a brief safer sex intervention for HIV outpatient clinics. *PfH* uses message framing, repetition, and reinforcement during patient visits to increase HIV positive patients' knowledge, skills, and motivations to practice safer sex. The program is designed to improve patient-provider communication about safer sex, disclosure of HIV serostatus, and HIV prevention. Implementation of *PfH* includes development of clinic and staff "buy-in" and training.
