A Message from JoAnne Keatley, Director, Center of Excellence for Transgender HIV Prevention and MAI Program Manager

I am so pleased to share with you some of the exciting developments that have occurred over the last year at the Center of Excellence for Transgender HIV Prevention (CoE)! It's hard to believe that we have been in existence now for just over a year. So much has been accomplished and yet, we have so much more to do! Unfortunately, transgender people continue to be disproportionately affected by HIV and AIDS. Providers are craving for the tools to better serve their patients. Below are a few highlights of our progress and new tools and services to assist you in conducting training in the region.

Beginning in July 2007 we successfully recruited and hired a dynamic team including the talented trainer, Lydia Sausa, CAPS researcher Jae Sevelius as well as our fantastic program assistant James Rouse led by me with the invaluable guidance of Michael Reyes to tackle the multiple CoE deliverables. We are proud to have an accomplished and diverse Community Advisory Board (CAB) comprised of 14 health professionals representing various regions of California that helps inform our work and vision.

We collaborated with our dedicated partners at the Center for HIV Information to help us build our fabulous website (launched Sept. 4)! Please be sure and visit the site often as we will continue to expand the research and training resources and information available to you.

We conducted a California review of existing transgender HIV prevention programs, gathered program information and developed an inventory for use by providers and community. The inventory is easy to use and is organized by population served, region and types of services offered. We also conducted a gap analysis to determine where California lacked resources to meet the needs of transgender populations and developed recommendations to assist the state in prioritizing needs to address.

Lydia led the effort to develop and pilot a 4-hour course designed for health professionals, titled ""Best Practices for HIV Prevention Among Trans People." The course utilizes interactive training methodologies, media technology, and adult learning theories to assure trainee's successful learning and skills development. Please see our new poster "Eight Best Practices for HIV Prevention among Trans People".

Additionally, we have surpassed the projected number of trainings throughout California to dates, responding to training requests in Los Angeles, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, San Diego and Alameda Counties.
